3 October: This Saturday the NDIA-RMC will have its next Edge of Space (EoS) Mission. The launch will be from Deer Trail, CO at 8:30am. The anticipated landing spot is about 40 miles SW of Limon, CO. This is a dedicated mission with only NDIA STEM experiments. There are four schools plus several home-schooled students participating in this mission. Approximately 354 students from Colorado, Texas, and Pennsylvania are participating. This mission will use a larger balloon and we hope to achieve 100K+ altitude. This could be a record for our EoS missions. On Saturday, 3 Oct, NDIA-RMC members can track the flight of our EoS high altitude balloon by going to https://track.eoss.org... we will have two transponders.
